



Camping Regulations 2026

Below is a summary of the most important points from our regulations:

Trailers

Trailers are only allowed on the premises for loading and unloading. They cannot be parked in the parking spaces on or around the campsite.

Liability

Camping Wedderbergen is never liable for any consequences of personal injury or material damage resulting from accidents, theft, fire, natural disasters, or any other loss or damage to goods and/or property during the stay at the campsite.

The camper is always fully responsible for all actions performed on the premises, including any damage, whether intentional or unintentional, caused to the property of the campsite or other guests.

Cars

Only one car per camping pitch/chalet is allowed. Each guest must park their car in their designated spot. Please avoid unnecessary driving to maintain field quality and ensure overall traffic safety.

A second car may be temporarily parked in a designated area only with prior approval from the reception. Parking on the access road or waiting lane is strictly prohibited!

Visitors

A visitor is defined as someone who visits the campsite but does not stay overnight or is registered at the campsite. We charge a fee for access to our facilities – see day tickets for details.

Note: Visitors are not allowed to bring pets.

Chemical Toilet

Toilets from caravans may only be emptied at the chemical toilet station located at the rear of the toilet building on the camping fields.

Drugs

The use, possession, or trade of drugs of any kind is strictly prohibited on the campsite. Any violation will result in immediate expulsion from the premises without exception.

Electricity / ICY (smart energy system)

At our camping pitches, we use a smart energy system (ICY). With this system, we work together to ensure a safe and stable electricity network across the park. The standard power supply per pitch is 8 amps. It is possible to upgrade to 10, 12, 14, or 16 amps for an additional fee.

Electricity usage is included up to a maximum of 8 kWh per day per campsite. Any consumption beyond this limit is automatically recorded and will be charged afterward at a rate of €0.50 per kWh. Usage is measured via the installed metering system, and these readings are binding. The campsite reserves the right to take appropriate measures in cases of structural or excessive consumption.

To prevent overloading the network and to ensure the safety of all guests, we monitor electricity usage through this system. In cases of extremely high or unusual consumption, we reserve the right to temporarily and automatically reduce the power supply. This will only be done when necessary to keep the network stable and safe. Any such adjustment is always temporary. No compensation will be provided for this.

For mowing purposes, electrical cables must not be left on the grass. Campers are required to have a proper residual-current circuit breaker (RCD) in their caravan, as mandated by network operator ENEXIS and fire insurance regulations.

Electric heaters

Electric heaters are not permitted on the campsite. These appliances consume a high amount of power and may cause overload of the electricity network. If unauthorized equipment is used or disruptions are caused, we may temporarily disconnect the power supply until the issue has been resolved.

We kindly ask you to use energy responsibly and to limit the simultaneous use of high-power electrical appliances.

Electric Scooters

Electric scooters, hoverboards, and fat bikes with an engaged (electro) motor are prohibited for safety reasons. The only exception is a special moped with a license plate, a minimum driving age of 16, and mandatory third-party liability insurance (WAM).

Bicycles

Bicycles outside camping pitches or chalets must be placed in the designated bike racks available near all public buildings on the campsite.

The area around the central facilities is a pedestrian zone – cycling is not allowed.

Photography & Privacy

Our house photographer regularly takes pictures during activities and captures general ambiance images throughout the season. A selection of these photos may be used for social media and promotional purposes.

Would you rather not be in a photo? Please inform the photographer or temporarily leave the location/activity.

Grass & Grounds

Camping guests must use breathable ground covers under their awnings/tents. Digging trenches or holes in the grass is not allowed. The grounds, plants, and structures may not be altered in any way.

Pets

A maximum of one pet is allowed per camping pitch for a fixed fee. Pets are only allowed in designated areas. All chalets are pet-free.

Note: Our central facilities, including playgrounds and sports fields, are pet-free. However, dogs are allowed on the restaurant terrace.

Waste & Glass

Household waste must be deposited in the designated press container at the reception for a fee of €1.50 per bag. The container processes only one bag at a time—depositing multiple bags may cause malfunctions! Placing garbage bags next to the container is strictly forbidden.

Glass should be disposed of in the designated glass container.

Overnight Guests

An overnight guest is someone who, with permission from both the registered guest and the campsite management, stays one or more nights on a camping pitch or in a chalet. A fee is charged for overnight stays and facility use.

Staff

Our staff is expected to perform their duties as efficiently as possible. If they observe campers violating the rules, which interferes with their work, they may inform the camper.

Instructions given by staff must always be followed. We expect our guests to treat employees, trainees, and interns with respect.

Wristbands

During school holidays, busy periods, and peak season, all guests are required to wear wristbands. Wristbands are provided at reception and must be worn immediately; they will not be handed out separately.

Restaurant

Camping Wedderbergen has a new self-service restaurant where orders are placed via kiosks and can only be paid for by card.

Sewage System

Each pitch is connected to a sewage system. Guests can collect wastewater or discharge it directly into the system. Dumping wastewater on the grounds is strictly prohibited.

Important: Do not flush baby wipes or moist toilet paper down the toilet, as this causes severe blockages, potentially leading to a sewage failure!

Barrier Gate

Our campsite is secured with a barrier gate system using license plate recognition. The barrier is closed from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM. During these hours, driving on the premises is prohibited.

Camping Wedderbergen is not liable for any damage caused by misuse or malfunctions of the barrier system.

Play Pond (Dogs Prohibited)

Playing and splashing in the swimming pond is at your own risk. Ensure that young children and non-swimmers are supervised and wear floatation devices or life jackets.

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are from 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM. Voices, musical instruments, and any devices producing sound must not be audible outside your own camping pitch/chalet, except for activities organized or approved by the campsite.

Have fun but be considerate of others!

Technical Support Outside Reception Hours

Staff are available from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM in the low season and from 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM in the high season. Outside these hours, we can only be reached by phone for emergencies.

Supervision

Camping Wedderbergen is not required to provide supervision at facilities such as the swimming pool, water playground, and indoor play hall. Parents are always responsible for their children.

Sanitary Facilities

We strive to keep our sanitary facilities clean. Please do not let small children go to the toilet alone, as accidents cause inconvenience for other guests and extra work for staff.

Dyeing hair and washing pets in the sanitary buildings is not allowed.

Encounter a dirty toilet or shower? Let us know immediately!

Water Usage

Camping Wedderbergen has its own water sources on the premises. During peak times and/or drought, we ask guests to use water sparingly. Water consumption is higher than many realize, especially in summer.

Tips: Take a shorter shower (by 1-2 minutes), use the toilet's eco-flush button, and turn off the tap while brushing your teeth.

Note: During summer vacation, filling inflatable pools or similar items is prohibited!

Swimming Facilities

Swimming in our facilities is at your own risk. Ensure that young children and non-swimmers are supervised and wear floatation devices or life jackets.

FINAL NOTE

In cases not covered by these regulations, the campsite management will make the final decision.
